PUBLIC OPINION STUDIES CENTER

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The Public Opinion Studies Center at the Asan Institute conducts public opinion surveys on a range of issues vital to South Korea's security, politics, and culture. Its reports are distributed around the world to government, media, and analysts and it is quickly becoming one of the most trusted sources for public opinion analysis in South Korea.



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ASAN DAILY SURVEY

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- The survey uses the three-day rolling average, and employs RDD for mobile and landline phones.

- The sample size for each is 1,000.

- The margin of error is $\pm 3.1\%$ at the 95% confidence level.
