## The Asan Plenum 2015, "Is the U.S. Back?"

April 28-29, the Grand Hyatt Hotel, Seoul

The Asan Institute for Policy Studies will host the *Asan Plenum 2015* on April 28(Tue.) – 29(Wed.) at the Grand Hyatt Hotel in Seoul.

Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Karen Elliott House will deliver the keynote address, and Foreign Affairs Minister Yun Byung-se will present the welcoming dinner speech.

The Conference will bring together distinguished experts, policymakers, scholars, and members of the media including:
